College Bound's Hall of Fame Award is presented to an individual or entity that has significantly supported and furthered the mission of College Bound. The 2019 Hall of Fame Award is presented to PNC Bank that has been unswerving in its support to College Bound. At PNC, employees bring diversity

and inclusion goals to life through Employee Business Resources Groups (EBRG). EBRGs are unique groups composed mostly of employees who share a common dimension of diversity, such as gender, sexual orientation, heritage or military service, among others.

Angela Alsobrooks

Community Leadership Award Recipient



A proud, life-long Prince Georgian, Angela, knew from an early age that she wanted to give back to the community that raised her and give a voice to those who might not otherwise have one.

After graduating from the University of Maryland Law School, Angela began her career as a Prince George's County Assistant State's Attorney in 1997, eventually becoming the county's first full-time prosecutor assigned to handle domestic violence cases. She tried and successfully prosecuted scores of cases against violent offenders.

In 2002, Angela was appointed by the County Executive to serve as Education Liaison, where she organized educational forums to help increase parental involvement in schools and environmental based learning opportunities. In 2003, she was appointed the Executive Director of

the County's Revenue Authority. Under her leadership, the agency increased revenue by 40% through their parking enforcement program and some of those funds were used to help the county maintain a balanced budget during the recession.

In 2010, overcoming a two-percent name recognition against a field of candidates who had all run for public office previously, Angela, by an overwhelming margin, was elected to serve as the County's State's Attorney, becoming the youngest and first woman to be elected to the office in Prince George's County.

As the State's Attorney, she led a staff of 100 attorneys and 110 professional administrative staff responsible for prosecuting people accused of committing crimes. As the County's top law enforcement official, Angela played a key role in public safety and strived to carry out her responsibilities in a firm, fair and consistent manner. She increased the office's budget by 40% and successfully fought for additional resources to ensure the office could appropriately support the needs of the community.

A hallmark of Angela's approach as State's Attorney was to engage the community to prevent further crime. She created a truancy reduction initiative that works with schools to keep kids on the right path as well as started a program called Back on Track – Prince George's, aimed at giving low-level, non-violent offenders a second chance in the community. Alsobrooks and her office played a major role in the record crime reduction the county has seen over the last several years and the 50% reduction in violent crime over the last several.

In November 2018, Angela was elected as the 8th County Executive for Prince George's County and the first woman to hold the position. Alsobrooks' administration is committed to providing a world-class education system, safe communities and a robust economy that creates jobs and opportunities for all and increases the commercial tax base to ensure residents are provided with the services they deserve.

Angela is a member of the First Baptist Church of Glenarden and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc. and is involved in the effort to raise breast cancer awareness in her community. Angela resides in Upper Marlboro with her daughter, Alex.

College Bound alumnae and scholarship recipient, Waliyah Johnson was enrolled in College Bound for three years at the Cesar Chavez site. As a sophomore at the University of Rochester, she is double majoring in African American studies and anthropology with a minor in journalism. Waliyah currently serves as the Minority Student Affairs Liaison for Student Government and on three executive boards: Rochester Business Association, Black Students' Union, Women's Leadership Alliance . After completion of her undergraduate studies, she plans to attend law school to reach her goal of becoming a corporate attorney. Aside from academics Waliyah started a non profit organization, Perfection Takes Time. Perfection Takes Time helps

students from low economic backgrounds develop academically, professionally and financially through mentorship and community service. This summer Ms. Johnson will be interning at Phone2Action as a Senior Fellow who oversees the fellowship program along with the operations department. Waliyah was College Bound's 2018 Juliette Tyler Lewis Civic Award recipient .





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
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
