



She is the recipient of the College Bound STEM Scholarship in 2019, as well as a recipient of the Board of Visitors Award at VCU in 2022. The Board of Visitors Award recognizes the achievements of an outstanding undergraduate student who represented the distinctive attributes of Outstanding Academic Achievement, Leadership and Service to the University and the community at large. Simone will be attending the University of Virginia's Summer Medical Leadership Program at the University of Virginia School of Medicine during the summer of 2023. She is the Vice President of Sisters & Stethoscopes, an organization that supports young Black women pursuing careers in healthcare. Simone also serves on the E-Board for VCU P.R.I.M.E. (Pre-Health and related interests Mentoring Experiences). VCU P.R.I.M.E. connects minority students to healthcare resources specific to their major. In addition, Simone serves as a mentor for five Freshman students through a program called You-First. The You-First Program is for first-year, first generation college students. Simone is interested in pursuing a career as a Family Medicine Physician, and her goal is to create free and accessible health care programs in areas that have low health care resources. Upon completion of her internship at UVA, Simone plans to attend Medical School to further her knowledge in pursuit of a degree in Medicine and her goal of becoming a Family Medicine Physician.

The Hall of Fame Award was established to salute individuals and or community groups who demonstrate ongoing support for the mission and services of College Bound. The mission of the Department of Education is to promote student achievement and preparation for global competitiveness by fostering educational excellence and ensuring equal access. Since the fall of 2012, the Department of Education has supported College Bound by hosting a weekly academic mentoring site. The site originated at the Federal Student Aid Office location and is currently hosted at ED's headquarters. Additionally, the Department of Education has provided mentors, conducted financial aide workshops, and provided FAFSA assistance for College Bound's staff, students, mentors, and families. For over a decade, ED professionals have used their expertise to improve the quality of College Bound's programming in the preparation of our students to matriculate and graduate from college with minimal debt. We are thankful for their continued support and pleased to present them with the 2023 Hall of Fame award.

It is our distinct honor to award the Department of Education the 2023 Hall of Fame Award for their ongoing commitment to the College Bound Progam.



Alexis K. Holmes is the Executive Director of the White House Initiative on Advancing Educational Equity, Excellence, and Economic Opportunity for

Black Americans, housed within the U.S. Department of Education. As the first woman and mom to lead the initiative, Mrs. Holmes brings more than 25 years of experience in government, public affairs, and public policy to proactively engage the black community on key priorities such as early childhood education, teacher diversity, black family voices, STEM access, and equitable distribution of federal resources. With an updated focus on equity and economic opportunity, the initiative, under her leadership, works collaboratively with more than two dozen interagency partners and national black organizations to coordinate and increase opportunities for black students, families, and communities. Prior to joining the Biden-Harris Administration, Mrs. Holmes was policy manager in the National Education Association's (NEA) Education Policy and Implementation Center. In this role, she advocated and advanced policies to support public education and working families at the national, state, and local level. Following the passage of the American Rescue Plan Act, Mrs. Holmes was instrumental in coordinating educators across the country to actively engage their state and local policymakers in order to take advantage of the Act's historic resource allocation. Previously, she was responsible for a policy portfolio that included secondary schools, career and technical education, and family engagement. Joining the NEA in 2007, Mrs. Homes was part of the inaugural team that led the organization's national outreach and engagement of the Black community. Before joining the NEA, Mrs. Holmes was Director of Federal Relations at College Board, where she worked closely with educators, institutions, community advocates, and civil rights allies to advance policies that supported every student's postsecondary aspiration, preparation, and success. Mrs. Holmes is a graduate of West Virginia University's School of Journalism with a focus on public relations and political science. She and her husband reside in Virginia, and are proud parents of a college freshman, high school junior, and spirited Belgian Malinois.

Supreme Court Justice, Sonya Sotomayor

Justice Sotomayor was born in Bronx, New York, on June 25, 1954. She earned a B.A. in 1976 from Princeton University, graduating summa cum laude and receiving the university's highest academic honor. In 1979, she earned a J.D. from Yale Law School where she served as an editor of the Yale Law Journal. She thereafter served as Assistant District Attorney in the New York County District Attorney's Office from 1979–1984. She then litigated international commercial matters in New York City at Pavia & Harcourt, where she was an associate and then partner from 1984–1992. In 1991, President George H.W. Bush nominated her to the U.S. District Court, Southern District of New York, and she served in that role from 1992–1998. She then served as a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit from 1998–2009. President Barack Obama nominated her as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court on May 26, 2009, and she assumed this role August 8, 2009.

Rev. Dr. Howard-John Wesley





Reverend Dr. Howard-John Wesley Pastor of Alfred Street Baptist Church Alexandria, Virginia

Rev. Dr. Howard-John Wesley is the exciting, gifted and anointed senior pastor of the historic Alfred Street Baptist Church (ASBC) in Alexandria, VA. A courageous, dynamic, and visionary leader, he is only the eighth pastor in the church's 217-year history of worshipping Christ while serving humankind. Currently, Dr. Wesley is part of the first of its kind in the world; the inaugural cohort of only

ten (10) exceptional students in the PhD in African American Preaching and Sacred Rhetoric program at the Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Under Dr. Wesley's extraordinary leadership, the Alfred Street Baptist Church has grown from 2,800 members to 10,000 members, 60,000 plus monthly online viewers and 80 active ministries with an emphasis on children's ministries and missions. To accommodate its favor and growth, the church holds four weekend worship services, including one on Saturday night. As a result, Dr. Wesley has launched an initiative to redesign and/or expand the current sanctuary and ministry facility. Dr. Wesley is regarded as one of the most prolific and prophetic voices of justice and grace in our generation. An empathetic pastor who is not afraid to take on social and political issues, Dr. Wesley led community protest marches against the New York grand jury's 2014 decision not to indict an NYPD officer whose chokehold led to the death of Eric Gardner. His sermon, "When the Verdict Hurts," was acknowledged in Time magazine's July 29, 2013 cover story, "After Trayvon" as one of the best sermons preached in the United States following the "not guilty" verdict in the State of Florida v. George Zimmerman, who fatally shot 17-year-old Trayvon Martin. Three of Dr. Wesley's sermons, "When the Verdict Hurts," "A Rizpah Response" (and with the black hoody he donned while preaching this sermon), and "Tell Your Own Story," have been archived in the faith-based collection of the National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC) in Washington, DC. With his guidance, Alfred Street Baptist Church became the first and only faith-based institution founding donor of the NMAAHC with a \$1 million donation. Dr. Wesley captivated some thought-provoking leaders of our great nation at the 2019 Congressional Black Caucus Foundation 2019 Prayer Breakfast as the Keynote Speaker with the sermonic address of "Let the Church Say Amen".

Zion Kelly is a recent alumnus of Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU), having completed his studies in the spring of 2023. Originally from Washington, DC, Zion is a proud graduate of Thurgood Marshall Academy. He is also an alumnus of the College Bound Mentoring Program, where he served as a site ambassador for two consecutive years at Beacon House and Walker Memorial Baptist Church. Zion is widely recognized as an activist and advocate against gun violence. His personal experiences have been the driving force behind his activism. His family has been deeply impacted by gun violence in Washington, D.C., and in 2017, he tragically lost his twin brother, Zaire Kelly, to gun violence. Since then, Zion has been committed to advocating for gun violence prevention and speaking up about issues that affect his community. Zion's advocacy work has earned him many accolades, including the New Founders New Activist Award, the PEN Toni and James Goodale Freedom of Expression Courage Award, and the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law 2018 Distinguished Civil Rights Advocate Award. He continues to advance his activism by standing up for his community and for all people of color, using his platform to promote social justice and equality. In collaboration with student leaders across the country, Zion has amplified the discussion of gun violence to be inclusive of all communities. He has delivered speeches at numerous events, including the historic March For Our Lives rally in Washington, D.C. Zion has also led his own speaking tour in Italy to promote non-violence and encourage student activism.

Keynote Speaker



Jason Reynolds, American Author

Jason Reynolds (born December 6, 1983) is an American author of novels and poetry for young adult and middle-grade audience. Born in Washington, D.C. and raised in neighboring Oxon Hill, Maryland, Reynolds found inspiration in rap and had an early focus on poetry, publishing several poetry collections

before his first novel in 2014, *When I Was The Greatest*, which won the Coretta Scott King/John Steptoe Award for New Talent.

In the next four years, Reynolds wrote eight more novels, most notably the New York Times best-selling Track series—*Ghost* (2016), *Patina* (2017), *Sunny* (2018), *Lu* (2018),—and As *Brave As You* (2016). *Ghost* was a National Book Award Finalist for Young People's Literature and *As Brave As You* won the Kirkus Prize, the NAACP Image Award for Outstanding Literary Work for Youth/Teen, and the Schneider Family Book Award. Reynolds also wrote a Marvel Comics novel called *Miles Morales: Spider-Man* (2017).

In 2017, Reynolds returned to poetry with *Long Way Down*, a novel in verse that was named a Newbery Honor book, a Printz Honor Book, and best young adult work by the Mystery Writers of America's Edgar Awards. In 2019, he wrote *Look Both Ways*, for which he won a Carnegie Medal.

Reynolds was named as the Library of Congress' national ambassador for young people's literature in January 2020-2022. He has appeared on The Late Show with Stephen Colbert, The Daily Show with Trevor Noah, Late Night with Seth Meyers, CBS Sunday Morning, Good Morning America, and various media outlets. He is on faculty at Lesley University, for the Writing for Young People MFA Program and lives in Washington, DC.
